





Renovations & Repairs



The Library secured grant funding to replace its two aging furnaces in the original 1903 building. The Library focused on heat pump technology as a solution for both heating and cooling. Heat pumps are able to extract usable heat from outside air, even on cold days, to provide a comfortable indoor temperature, the process is reversed on warm days. This project will replace two existing outdoor compressors, two furnaces, and the air handling equipment. The project will improve efficiency, require no combustion, eliminate carbon monoxide risk, require less maintenance, and allow for better control over temperature.

The Library has started work to secure funding for a project to cover the 2800 square foot flat roof of the 1993 addition to begin in 2025.











Youth Services & Teens

Both the Children's and Teen rooms held hundreds of engaging and wellattended programs this year. We had the highest number of Summer Reading Program participants ever and formed new collaborations with local organizations. We now offer several new weekend programs such as Stories on Saturdays, Cuentos y Canciones (a bilingual Story Time), and STEAM on Saturdays to allow working parents to attend library programs with their children.

We added a few passive activities for our young people to do while visiting the library, such as Take and Make Craft Kits and Scavenger Hunts, and all have been very well received. We also started a new TikTok account to show some creative glimpses into our daily Library life.

Adult Services

In August 2023, we welcomed Nanor Pogosian as our programming and outreach librarian. Throughout the year, we saw higher-than-average adult participation in summer reading, new programs such as Friday Night Film School, Meet the Artist events and workshops through our new programs information specialist, Kristine Kumpf, an all-staff art expo, collaborations with other local Libraries, even several cat adoption events!
