




The Cross Legged Princess (circa. 1880) is a vestige of Nyack's bustling 20th Century. The Princess was an emblem of Traverson's Wooden Indian restaurant, the town's local hub which served Nyack for almost 35 years. 4. Salisbury House John Dow (American, 1905-2003)

Dow was a painter and elected member of The United States Congress (1967, 1973). Salisbury House, also known as the Cornelison or Salisbury Manor, was built in 1770 by noted land owner Michael Cornelison, settling his family in Nyack. At the time of its demolition in 1950, it remained the oldest standing house in Nyack.


