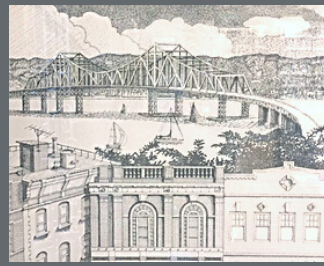

Originally built in 1880, this house became the home of American author Carson McCullers when she moved to Nyack in 1945. McCuller's home hosted many prominent creatives of the time such as Tennessee Williams, Isak Dinesen, Arthur Miller and Marilyn Monroe.

Spending the last twenty years of her life as a Nyack resident, McCullers finished her final works, *The Member of the Wedding*, *Clock Without Hands*, and *The Ballad of Sad Cafe* at the house.

The Cross Legged Princess (circa. 1880) is a vestige of Nyack's bustling 20th Century. The Princess was an emblem of Traverson's Wooden Indian restaurant, the town's local hub which served Nyack for almost 35 years. The Princess was donated to the library by it's owners, Pat and Helen O'Gorman, as a memorial to Ed Traverson of the Traverson Family.

This Reamarque Proof of Andrew Carnegie was published by Hungarian artist Jacques Reich (1852-1923) in 1906. Reich was a student of William Adolphe-Bouguereau.

Judge Mortimer B. Patterson (1875-1957) was elected to the United States Supreme Court in November 1935, serving as justice until his retirement in 1945. At the time of his death, Patterson served as a member of the Board of Directors for the Nyack Library. In 1973, the Mortimer B. Patterson Memorial Addition was added to the library building.

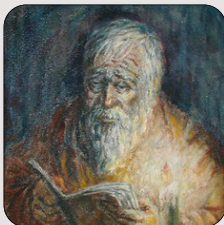


3. *Children*

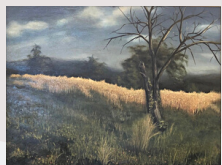

Mortimer Borne (Poland, 1902-1987)

Borne worked as an author and as an interdisciplinary artist in painting, printmaking, and sculpture. Borne moved to Nyack in 1937, and lived here until his death in 1987. Borne's work is in the permanent collections of many institutions including The Museum of Modern Art, The National Gallery, and The Metropolitan Museum of Art. The Nyack Library has ten of Borne's works in our collection.

John Dow (American, 1905-2003)

Dow was a painter and elected member of The United States Congress (1967, 1973). Salisbury House, also known as the Cornelison or Salisbury Manor, was built in 1770 by noted land owner Michael Cornelison, settling his family in Nyack. At the time of its demolition in 1950, it remained the oldest standing house in Nyack.

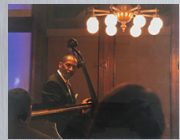
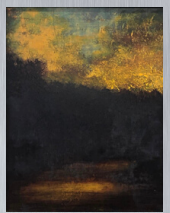

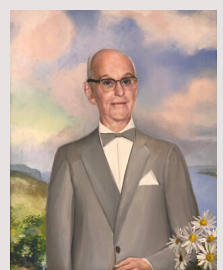
